Propaganda poster/illustration

Propaganda is used to convince others to think a certain way or to do something in response to the message.

Create a poster with a slogan and illustrations intended to convince others to support your dystopian society or to rebel against it.

On the back of your poster, explain why your message fits the definition of propaganda.



National Anthem Lyrics

Must be at least 20 lines long.

Must contain details that relate to your dystopian society.



Illustration of a person or persons from your dystopia

Illustration must contain labeled elements from your dystopian society.

This project works best for societies where conformity is visible.



Map of your dystopian community

Must be labeled and contain a key.

The idea is to show the different key buildings and places within your community. For instance, if citizens must participate in certain events at specific locations, those are some of the places that need to be labeled.

Political Cartoon

Must be labeled and contain a key.

The idea is to show the main buildings and places within your community. For instance, if citizens must participate in certain events at specific locations, those are some of the places that need to be labeled.

Newspaper Article

Must be formatted as a news article:

- headline
- by line (your name, name of your society)
- “the story”
- image(s)

Political Speech

- May be “for” or “against” your society
- Should be at least ½ page 12”font, 1”margin
 - If typing in class, you will need to complete a handwritten rough draft first.

Commercial or Advertisement

- video
- at least 30 seconds long

Journal Entry

- from the point of view of an oppressed citizen
- contains enough details that the reader has a sense of what it is like to live in the dystopian society and the type of oppression the citizen is experiencing
