- 1. The proper ingredients for making bread are flour, water, milk, butter, and yeast.
- First, dissolve the yeast in warm water.
- Add sugar and flour and let the mixture rise in a bowl.
- Add warm milk and more flour and knead the dough on a wooden board.
- Again, let the dough rise, punch it down, shape it, and bake each loaf for thirty minutes.
- Remove loaves from the oven and let them cool in their pans for a short while.
- Then, take the bread out of the loaf pans and place each loaf on a cooling rack. If you said "loaf pans,"
